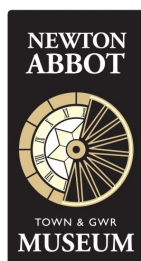
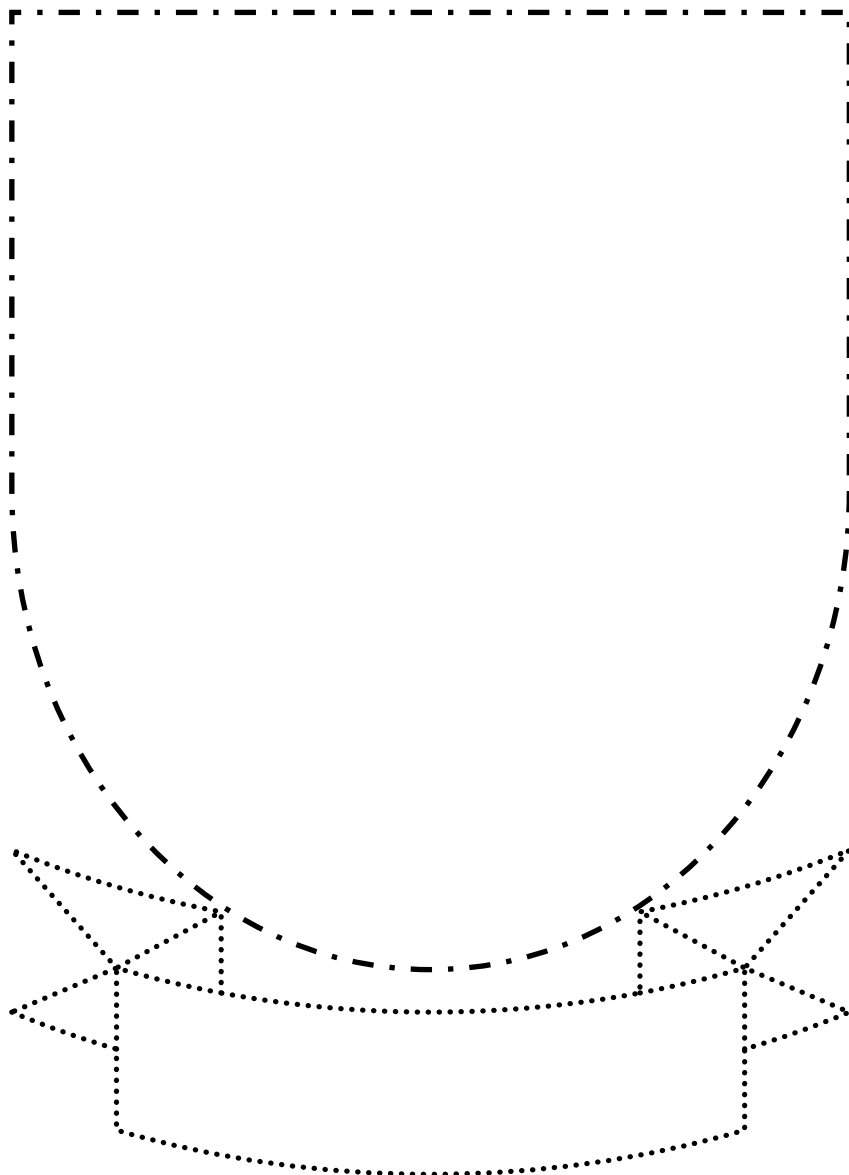


Create your own coat of arms

From 1894 Newton Abbot and Newton Bushel were governed by separate District Councils, until 1901 when a united Council for both districts was formed. After this the name of Newton Bushel gradually gave way to that of Highweek, and that of Bushel survived only as one of the town's Wards, with both areas known as Newton Abbot from this point. It is likely that this name was kept due to the continuation of the market in this area, as well as the presence of the Tower.



As an outward and visible sign of the union, the insignia of the two districts (the three bushels of Newton Bushel and the mitre, crozier, lamb and tower of Newton Abbot) were amalgamated to form the town's coat of arms.
